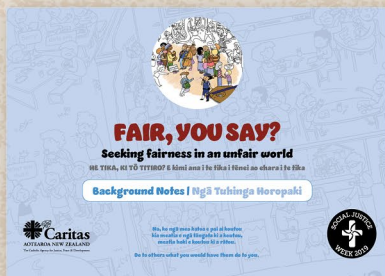

There is a range of resources available online to help teachers and students engage with the issues and to make decisions for the future.

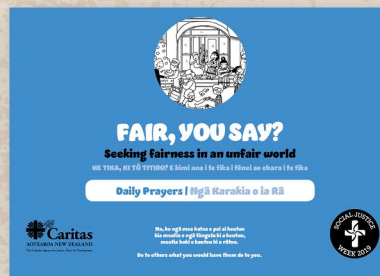

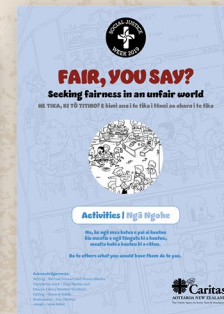

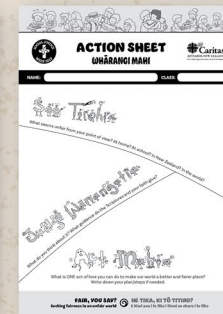

Hidden treasures

Lots of objects are hidden in the poster and students are encouraged to reflect on how these relate to fairness.

Wordfind

A selection of words relating to fairness can be found in the poster and will provide a perfect platform for further discussion.

Personal reflection

Students are challenged to identify examples of both fairness and unfairness and to rank them accordingly. The connection to personal past experiences and future decisions is raised, as well as an opportunity to reflect on how Jesus would have acted in similar scenarios within the poster.
